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Introduction

Before it became an international quilting phenomenon, Sylvia's Bridal Sampler began within a story. The novel *The Master Quilter*, to be precise.

In the sixth book in my Elm Creek Quilts series, the staff of a fictional quilters' retreat in picturesque central Pennsylvania conspire to create an extraordinary sampler quilt to celebrate the wedding of founder Sylvia Bergstrom Compson to her beloved Andrew. Sarah, Summer, and the other Elm Creek Quilters spread the word, asking Sylvia's friends, family, and former students to contribute $6'' \times 6''$ blocks expressing what Sylvia means to each of them as a quilter, teacher, or friend. Blocks soon began arriving from across the country and around the world, accompanied by heartfelt letters expressing abiding friendship and admiration for the renowned Master Quilter. After twists and turns of the plot, in which the blocks are lost and then recovered, Sylvia's friends present her with a beautiful quilt that celebrates the joy of her marriage, as well as the enduring bonds of friendship.

I always enjoy making the quilts featured in my novels so that I can display them on my book tours and on my website. As I awaited the publication of *The Master Quilter*, I followed the Elm Creek Quilters' example and enlisted the help of 72 talented quilting friends from across the country. Supplied with drawings of the blocks and fat eighths from my first fabric line—Sylvia's Collection from Red Rooster Fabrics—my helpers eagerly took to the task. Before long, I had collected 140 lovingly sewn blocks, each bearing the unique tastes of its maker and enhanced by Sue Vollbrecht's beautiful longarm quilting.

Wherever I displayed Sylvia's Bridal Sampler, readers and quilters alike admired it, and many remarked that they would like to make one of their own. To get them started, I included patterns for five of the blocks in my second pattern book, *Return to Elm Creek*. But soon after that book was published, quilters began requesting the remaining 135 blocks, which could not be included in the book due to space limitations.

How could I honor these many requests as quickly as possible? Because so many of the requests for patterns had come via email, the Internet seemed the best solution. So in June 2005, I created a Sylvia's Bridal Sampler website, including a blog in which I posted a new block pattern



every few days. To my delight, quilters began sending in photos of the blocks they had made; with their permission, I posted those photos in a website gallery for other quilters to admire. As the number of Sylvia's Bridal Sampler quilters steadily grew, I created a mailing list so they could exchange advice, offer one another encouragement, and proudly announce milestones they had achieved in their SBS journeys.

To help keep everyone motivated, I launched a Block of the Week program in January 2007, which is still going strong under the direction of Debbie Markowitz. Just for fun, we've held block swaps that have strengthened the bonds of friendship among Sylvia's Bridal Sampler quilters from around the world—and have also resulted in beautiful quilts.

The interest in Sylvia's Bridal Sampler sparked by those five patterns in *Return to Elm Creek* has spread beyond my own website to other thriving online communities. Kansas quilter Kathy Tattershall runs an online discussion list amusingly titled The SBS Offline Quilters. "Kathy has kept us motivated to complete our blocks through monthly challenges and has sent out prizes for those of us who complete the challenge," reports Debbie Madigan, the list moderator, who adds that many of the list members have set up online photo albums to display their completed blocks.

Dutch quilter Annelies van den Bergh, an accomplished quilter and one of the most popular members of the Sylvia's Bridal Sampler mailing list, now sponsors her own mailing list for other Dutch quilters who have been inspired to make their own Sylvia's Bridal Samplers. In early 2006, German quilter Heike Jesse discovered the patterns posted on my website and quickly spread the word to her quilting circle, the Quiltfriends. Before long, she launched her own website, where German quilters post images of their Sylvia's Bridal Samplers in progress on virtual design walls and exchange advice and support. In 2007, Paris quilter Estelle Morin launched a mailing list and website for 23 French-speaking aspiring Sylvia's Bridal Sampler quiltmakers. "Since September, we have been having a Block of the Week challenge," Estelle says. "The members of the list take their turns and give a block every Friday, and then we upload our blocks in the appropriate photo albums. Two of our members have been going through difficult times, so we showed them our support by making SBS blocks for them." Sylvia and the Elm Creek Quilters would surely applaud their kindness and compassion.

Another online group is truly international in scope: The Friends of Elm Creek, created by St. Petersburg, Florida, quilter Althea Conger. These quilters, who hail from the United States, Canada, Ireland, Belgium, France, and Australia, enjoy swapping friendship blocks using patterns from Sylvia's Bridal

Sampler. "This has been a really enjoyable experience for all of us," Althea says. "We have posted pictures of ourselves so we can 'see' the friends we 'talk' to on a daily basis. We have really become good friends and are already planning our next Christmas block project."

But not all Sylvia's Bridal Sampler groups meet online. In Melbourne, Australia, quilters gather at Foothills Fabrics and Threads every month for a Sylvia's Bridal Sampler Sit and Sew. "We are a very mixed bunch of ladies working at our own pace," says shop owner Sandra Mclay. "Some of us are romping through the blocks, whilst others like myself are just plodding along. But we are all certainly enjoying ourselves and are building friendships." These friendships are far-ranging, indeed; some quilters visiting Australia from abroad, such as mailing list favorite Anne Ida Røkeness from Norway, have added a visit to Foothills Fabrics to their itineraries so that they could meet other Sylvia's Bridal Sampler quilters they had originally met via the Internet.

Back in the United States, the Maxville Branch Library Second Saturday Quilting Bees meet in Jacksonville, Florida, to work on their Sylvia's Bridal Samplers together. Elise Fare, an employee of the library and an experienced quilter, set up the program when she heard that local aspiring quilters in the area were interested in taking lessons. The Bees are a mix of beginners and more experienced quilters, Elise explains, adding, "The beginners are getting instructions and those with experience teach and assist the beginners." When Elise's quilt is complete, the quilters plan to display it in the library for a time to thank the staff for providing the Bees with a place to meet.

At Tiny Stitches quilt shop in Marietta, Georgia, the members of the Elm Creek Quilts Club meet on the first Sunday afternoon of each month to work on their Sylvia's Bridal Samplers together. They assign four new blocks to accomplish in the weeks ahead, share the blocks they have completed since their last meeting, discuss the Elm Creek Quilts novels, and enjoy refreshments. "We have about ten to twelve ladies working on the Bridal Sampler," says club member Melinda Fulkerson. "Mine is being done in batik scraps and white background. We have 1930s, blue and white, pink and green, completely scrappy, and lots of other combinations."

After all, there are limits to what the Internet can offer, and a pattern book would make the task of acquiring the templates and instructions easier and more convenient. Therefore I was delighted when C&T Publishing agreed to make all 140 blocks available, as well as photos of wonderful Sylvia's Bridal Samplers created by quilters from around the world.

If the story of these new Sylvia's Bridal Samplers has captured your imagination the way the original, fictional version did in *The Master Quilter*, I invite you to try your hand at several, many, or all 140 of these pretty blocks, whether you create your own versions of Sylvia's Bridal Sampler or unite them in new combinations to create an exciting original design all your own. However you use these patterns, I hope you will enjoy your journey and share your achievements online at www.sylviasbridalsampler.com. There's always room for more friends in the bridal party!





Fabric Requirements

Note: These figures are approximations only. Yardage amounts will vary depending on your fabric choices in each individual block.

 Beiges: 10 yards (includes 2½ yards for the sashing and the inner border)

Light roses or reds: 1½ yards
 Dark roses or reds: 1½ yards

■ Light greens: 2 yards

Dark greens: 2 yards (includes % yard for the middle border)

■ Medium greens: 1½ yards

• Light blues: 1½ yards

 Medium blues: 4¾ yards (includes 2½ yards for the outer border and ¾ yard for the binding)

■ Dark blues: 1½ yards

Medium tans and browns:
 1½ yards

■ Batting: 95" × 123"

■ Backing: 8% yards

Sylvia Andrew

Sylvia Bergstrom and Andrew Cooper met in childhood, but it wasn't until they reunited at Elm Creek Manor more than 50 years later that they fell in love and decided to marry. While the Elm Creek Quilters were thrilled that their favorite Master Quilter had discovered new love in her golden years, Andrew's son and daughter were reluctant to see their widowed father remarry. Rather than hold a ceremony his children would not attend, Sylvia and Andrew celebrated a surprise Christmas Eve wedding in the ballroom of Elm Creek Manor, surrounded by their dearest friends.

After enjoying a honeymoon in New York City, Sylvia and Andrew traveled to Andrew's daughter's home in Connecticut, where they announced their big news and took their first steps toward reconciliation. Eventually Andrew's children realized how misguided their objections had been, and they welcomed Sylvia to the family with warmth and affection.

Andrew's children were not the only ones to have been momentarily confounded by Sylvia and Andrew's surprise wedding. Because the Elm Creek Quilters had not expected the couple to marry so soon, they had not sewn even a single stitch for the wedding quilt. Rather than delay presenting the newlyweds with a gift befitting the joyous occasion, the Elm Creek Quilters requested 6-inch blocks from Sylvia's friends, colleagues, and former students, a wonderful variety of blocks that became Sylvia's Bridal Sampler.

In the years to come, Sylvia would often reflect that if she and Andrew had not unexpectedly moved up the date of their wedding, Sylvia's Bridal Sampler never would have been created.

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




- 1. Cut 2 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 16"—one from background fabric and the other from green. Place the strips together, right sides facing, and sew along the longest edge. Press toward the green fabric.
- 2. With a rotary cutter, cross cut 10 strips 1½" wide from the strip set. Join the strips in pairs, right sides and opposite colors facing, and sew together along the long edge to make 5 fourpatches. Press.
- 3. From brown fabric, cut 4 rectangles $1\%'' \times 3\frac{1}{4}''$. Cut 2 of the rectangles in half once from the lower left corner to

- the upper right corner to make 4 B triangles. Cut the remaining 2 rectangles in half once from the lower right corner to the upper left corner to make 4 mirror-image B reverse (Br) triangles.
- 4. Make 4 triangles from background fabric using template pattern A.
- 5. Sew 1 B triangle and 1 Br triangle to each A triangle. Press.
- **6.** Sew the block segments into 3 rows as shown. Press. Sew the rows together.





- 1. Cut 8 squares from red fabric using template pattern A. Cut 2 squares from background fabric using template pattern A.
- 2. Cut 2 squares $3\frac{1}{4}$ " × $3\frac{1}{4}$ " from background fabric. Cut each square diagonally twice to make 8 B triangles.
- 3. Cut 2 squares 1% × 1% from background fabric. Cut each square diagonally once to make 4 C triangles.
- 4. Cut 1 rectangle from background fabric using template D.
- 5. Sew the pieces into diagonal rows as shown. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.






Option 1: Traditional Piecing

1. From background fabric, make 4 of template pattern C. From light blue fabric, make 4 of template pattern B. From dark blue fabric, make 1 of template pattern A.

2. Join the block pieces into 3 rows as shown. Press.




3. Using Y-seam construction, join the rows. Sew from point to point only. Do not sew into the seam allowances. Press.

Option 2: Foundation Paper Piecing

- **1.** Make 4 of the Amethyst foundation pattern. Press.
- **2.** Arrange the foundations as shown and sew into 2 rows. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.




Template patterns are on page 86.

- 1. From brown fabric, make 2 of template A and 2 of template B.
- 2. From background fabric, cut 1 square 3%" × 3%". Cut the square in half diagonally once to make 2 large background C triangles.

- 3. From background fabric, cut 4 squares 2%" \times 2%". Cut each square in half diagonally once to make 8 small background D triangles.
- **4.** Sew 2 small background D triangles to each A trapezoid and 2 to each B trapezoid. Press.
- **5.** Sew a large background C triangle to each A trapezoid unit. Press.
- **6.** Sew each A unit from Step 5 to a B unit from Step 4 to make 2 block halves. Press.

7. Sew the block halves together. Press.



(Block G-10)




- **1.** From background fabric, cut 4 A squares $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $1\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 2. From background fabric, cut 4 B rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 3. From background fabric, cut 6 squares 1%" \times 1%". Cut each square in half once diagonally to make 12 small background C triangles.

- 4. From red fabric, cut 10 squares 11%" × 11%". Cut each square in half once diagonally to make 20 small red D triangles. Pair each light C triangle with a dark D triangle and sew together along the longest edge to make 12 triangle-squares. Press.
- 5. From background fabric, cut 1 square 3¼" × 3¼". Cut the square in half twice diagonally to make 4 large background F triangles. Take the remaining small red D triangles and sew 2 to each large background F triangle to make 4 Flying Geese units. Press.
- **6.** Cut 1 E square $2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " from red fabric. Sew 2 background B rectangles to opposite sides of the red E square. Press. Sew 2 Flying Geese to the back-

ground rectangles to complete the center row. Press.

7. Arrange the remaining squares and triangle-squares as shown and sew into rows. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.



- 1. Cut 4 A squares $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 1\frac{1}{2}"$ from dark blue, 4 B squares $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 1\frac{1}{2}"$ from background fabric, and 8 C squares $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 1\frac{1}{2}"$ from light green. Cut 1 D square $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$ from brown.
- 2. Cut 4 squares 1\%" × 1\%" from light green and 4 squares 1\%" × 1\%" from

- dark green. Cut each square once diagonally to make 8 dark green E triangles and 8 light green F triangles. Pair each dark green E triangle with a light green F triangle, right sides together, and sew along the longest edge to make 8 triangle-squares. Press.
- 3. Cut 4 squares 1%" × 1%" from dark green. Cut each square once diagonally to make 8 dark green triangles. Cut 1 square 3¼" × 3¼" from background fabric. Cut the background square twice diagonally to make 4 background G triangles. Pair each background G triangle with 2 dark green E triangles, right sides together, and sew to make 4 Flying Geese units. Press.

4. Sew the E/G Flying Geese, E/F triangle-squares, and A, B, C, and D squares into five rows as shown. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.



(Block J-4)




Template patterns are on pages 86 and 87.

- 1. From background fabric, cut 2 rectangles using template A, 6 small triangles using template B, 1 large triangle using template C, 1 large triangle using the reverse of template C (Cr), and 1 square using template D.
- 2. From dark green, cut 1 trapezoid using template E, 2 trapezoids using template F, 3 trapezoids using the reverse of template F (Fr), and 1 kite using template G.

- 3. Sew 1 small background B triangle to each E, F, and Fr. Press. Pair each Fr unit with an F unit and sew together as shown. Press. (You will have 1 Fr unit left over.)
- **4.** As shown, sew a background A rectangle to each F/Fr pair: one A to the F side of one pair and the other A to the Fr side of the other pair. Press.
- **5.** Sew the C and Cr triangles to the dark green kite G. Press. Add an A/F/Fr unit to complete the top row as shown. Press.
- 6. Using your favorite appliqué method, prepare a stem from brown fabric using template H. Appliqué the stem onto the D square. (Note: You may leave the end of the stem as a raw edge where it joins the leaf. It will be hidden within the seam allow-

- ance when the separate units are sewn together.)
- 7. Sew the remaining Fr/B unit to the stem square. Press. Add the E/B unit as shown. Press.
- **8.** To make the bottom row, sew the remaining F/F/A unit to the unit created in Step 7. Press. Sew the 2 rows together. Press.

(Block A-10)




Template pattern is on page 87.

- 1. From blue fabric, cut 4 pieces using the reverse of template A (Ar). From green fabric, cut 4 pieces using template A.
- 2. Pair the green A's with the blue Ar's, right sides together, and sew along the

longest edge, sewing only from point to point. Do not sew into the seam allowance at either end. Press.

- **3.** From red fabric, cut 4 B squares $2'' \times 2''$.
- **4.** Set the red B squares into the angles between the green and blue A's. Press.
- **5.** Cut 2 squares 2%" \times 2%" from background fabric. Cut each square once along the diagonal to create 4 C triangles.
- **6.** Sew 1 C triangle to each A/Ar/B unit as shown. Press.
- 7. Cut 1 D square 2%" × 2%" from background fabric.

8. Sew 2 of the units created in Step 6 to opposite sides of the D square. Press. Using Y-seam construction, attach the remaining 2 units, sewing the seams in the order shown. Sew only from point to point, not into the seam allowances. Press.





- 1. From background fabric, cut:
 - 4 A squares $1\frac{1}{4}$ " × $1\frac{1}{4}$ ".
 - 2 squares $3^{1/8}'' \times 3^{1/8}''$. Cut each square in half diagonally once to make 4 large background B triangles.
 - 12 squares $1^{5/8}$ " × $1^{5/8}$ ". Cut each square in half diagonally once to make 24 small background C triangles.

- 2. From green fabric, cut:
 - 2 squares $3^{1/8}'' \times 3^{1/8}''$. Cut each square in half diagonally once to make 4 large green D triangles.
 - 12 squares $1^5/8'' \times 1^5/8''$. Cut each square in half diagonally once to make 24 small green E triangles.
- 3. Pair each large green D triangle with a large background B triangle, right sides together, and sew along the longest edge to make 4 large trianglesquares. Press. Repeat with the small triangles to make 24 small trianglesquares.
- 4. Sew together 3 small trianglesquares from Step 3 to make a row. Press. Repeat to make a total of 4. Sew together the remaining triangle-squares in groups of 3 to make 4 mirror-image rows. Press.

- 5. As shown, sew 1 triangle-square row to the green half of 1 large triangle-square. Press. Repeat with the 3 remaining identical triangle-square rows.
- **6.** Sew the small background A squares to the green ends of the mirror-image triangle-square rows. Press.
- 7. Sew each mirror-image row from Step 6 to a large triangle-square unit from Step 5 to make 4 block quarters. Press.
- **8.** Sew the block quarters into 2 rows as shown. Press. Sew the rows together. Press.





Template and foundation patterns are on page 87.

- 1. Make 4 of foundation paper piecing pattern A. Press. Make 4 of foundation paper piecing pattern B. Press. Pair each A foundation with a B foundation and sew together. Press.
- 2. Make 4 rectangles from background fabric using template C. Make 1 square from blue using template D.
- 3. Sew the A/B foundation units, C rectangles, and D square into 3 rows as shown. Sew the 3 rows together. Press.





Foundation patterns are on page 88.

- 1. Make 2 of foundation paper piecing pattern A for the top and bottom rows. Press. Make 1 each of foundation paper piecing patterns B and C. Press.
- 2. Sew the B foundation to the C foundation to make the center row. Press.
- 3. Sew the 3 rows together as shown.



- 1. From background fabric, cut 3 squares 2\%" × 2\%". Cut each square in half once diagonally to make 6 background A triangles.
- 2. From green fabric, cut 1 square 2%" × 2%" and cut in half once diagonally to make 2 green B triangles. (You will use only 1 of these triangles for this block; the other may be set aside.) Repeat using blue and brown fabrics.


- 3. Sew 1 background A triangle to each B triangle to make 3 trianglesquares. Press.
- 4. Sew 2 triangle-squares together and attach a background triangle as shown. Press.
- 5. Sew the remaining 2 background triangles to the third triangle-square as shown. Press.
- 6. Sew the units created in Steps 4 and 5 together. Press.

7. From green fabric, cut 1 square 6% × 6% and cut in half once diagonally to make 2 green C triangles. (You will use only 1 of these triangles for this block; the other may be set aside.) Sew the green C triangle to the pieced triangle created in Step 6 as shown. Press.



- 1. From dark green, cut 1 strip 11/8" × 18". From blue, cut 1 strip 11/8" × 18". From light green, cut 2 strips 11/8" × 18".
- 2. Pair the dark green strip with a light green strip, right sides together, and sew along the longest edge. Press the seam toward the dark fabric. With a rotary cutter, trim off one end of the strip pair at a 45° angle. Cut 4 strips 1½" wide at this angle. Cut 4 more 1½" wide strips at the opposite 45° angle, as shown.



- 3. Repeat Step 2 with the blue strip and the remaining light green strip. Press the seam toward the blue fabric.
- 4. Pair each blue/light green strip with a light green/dark green strip, right sides together, and sew to make 8 star points. Press.









- 1. From dark red, make 1 square using template A.
- 2. From medium red, make 2 partial squares using template B. From background fabric, make 2 more partial squares using template B.
- 3. Sewing from point to point only, sew the 2 medium red B partial squares to opposite sides of the A square. Do not sew into the seam allowances. Press.
- 4. Use Y-seam construction to sew the background fabric B partial squares to opposite sides of the unit from Step 3. Sew the seams in the order shown and do not sew into the seam allowances. Press toward the darker fabrics.







SASHING AND BORDERS

Cutting

Beige: Cut 5 strips 6½" wide. Cut into 130 short sashing strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Cut 23 strips 1½" wide. Sew diagonally end to end. Cut 9 long sashing strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $97\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Cut 6 strips 1½" wide. Sew diagonally end to end. Cut 2 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $97\frac{1}{2}$ " for the inner long borders.

Cut 4 strips 1½" wide. Sew the strips together in pairs with diagonal seams. Cut a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $71\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from each pair for the inner short borders.

Dark green: Cut 6 strips 2½" wide. Sew diagonally end to end. Cut 2 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $99\frac{1}{2}$ " for the middle long borders.


Cut 4 strips 21/2" wide. Sew the strips together in pairs with diagonal seams. Cut a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $75\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from each pair for the middle short borders.

Medium blue: Cut 6 strips 6½" wide. Sew diagonally end to end. Cut 2 strips $6\frac{1}{2}$ " × $103\frac{1}{2}$ " for the outer long borders.

Cut 6 strips 6½" wide. Sew diagonally end to end. Cut 2 strips $6\frac{1}{2}$ " × $87\frac{1}{2}$ " for the outer short borders.

OUILT ASSEMBLY

- 1. Arrange the sampler blocks in 10 rows of 14 blocks. Sew the blocks together with short sashing strips. Press the seams toward the sashing strips. (Note: If any of the blocks have an obvious up-and-down orientation, decide whether you prefer a vertical or horizontal orientation for your quilt and arrange all directional blocks accordingly.)
- 2. Sew the sampler block rows together, separated by the long sashing strips. Press toward the sashing strips.
- 3. Sew the long beige inner borders to the long sides of the quilt. Press toward the border. Sew the short beige inner borders to the short sides of the quilt. Press toward the border.
- 4. Sew the long dark green middle borders to the long sides of the quilt. Press toward the green border. Sew the short dark green middle borders to the short sides of the quilt. Press toward the green border.
- **5.** Sew the long medium blue outer borders to the long sides of the quilt. Press toward the blue border. Sew the short medium blue outer borders to the short sides of the quilt. Press toward the blue border.
- **6.** Refer to your favorite basic quilting book to layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste. Quilt as desired. Attach a hanging sleeve, and bind. (Note: If you are using signature squares, these can be pieced together to make the quilt backing.)
- 7. If you did not use signature squares for the quilt backing, tributors. Appliqué this panel to the back of the quilt.







